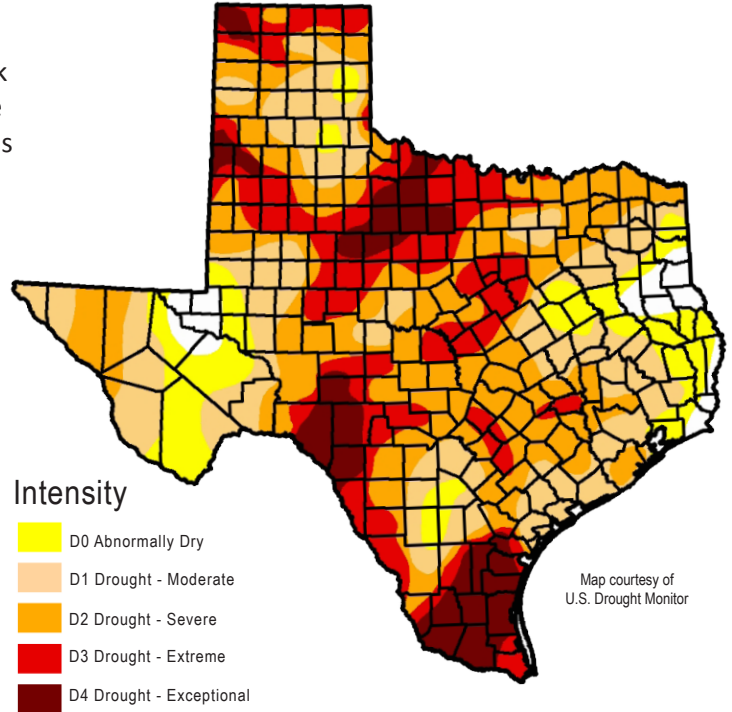


CURRENT DROUGHT CONDITIONS

Drought conditions deteriorated notably over the past week with a jump from 88 percent to 96 percent of Texas in some state of drought. Declining statewide reservoir storage levels continue to set new record lows for this time of year.

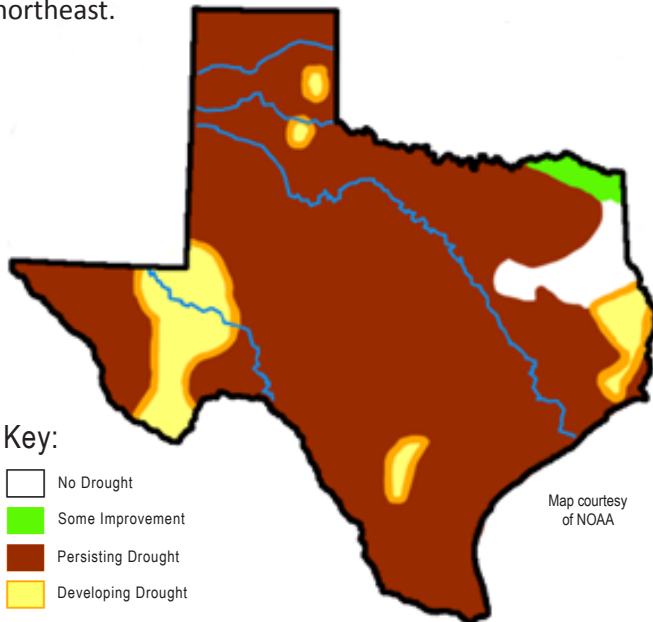
Current Drought statistics

- 96% of state currently in drought
- 88% a week ago
- 95% three months ago
- 93% a year ago



SEASONAL DROUGHT OUTLOOK 3/12/13–6/30/13

The latest seasonal drought outlook is much more pessimistic than the previous outlook, showing continued and expanding drought through the end of June for all of Texas except for bits of the northeast.



RESERVOIR CONDITIONS (%FULL)

Statewide Reservoir statistics

- Currently 66% full
- 67% a week ago
- 65% three months ago
- 78% a year ago
- Normally 85% at this time

Key reservoir levels

- Amistad (Lower Rio Grande Valley area): 45%
- Choke Canyon (Corpus Christi area): 44%
- Elephant Butte (El Paso area): 11%
- Lavon (Dallas area): 62%
- Livingston (Houston area): 100%
- Meredith (Amarillo-Lubbock area): 0%
- O.H. Ivie (San Angelo-Midland-Odessa area): 21%
- Travis (Austin area): 38%
