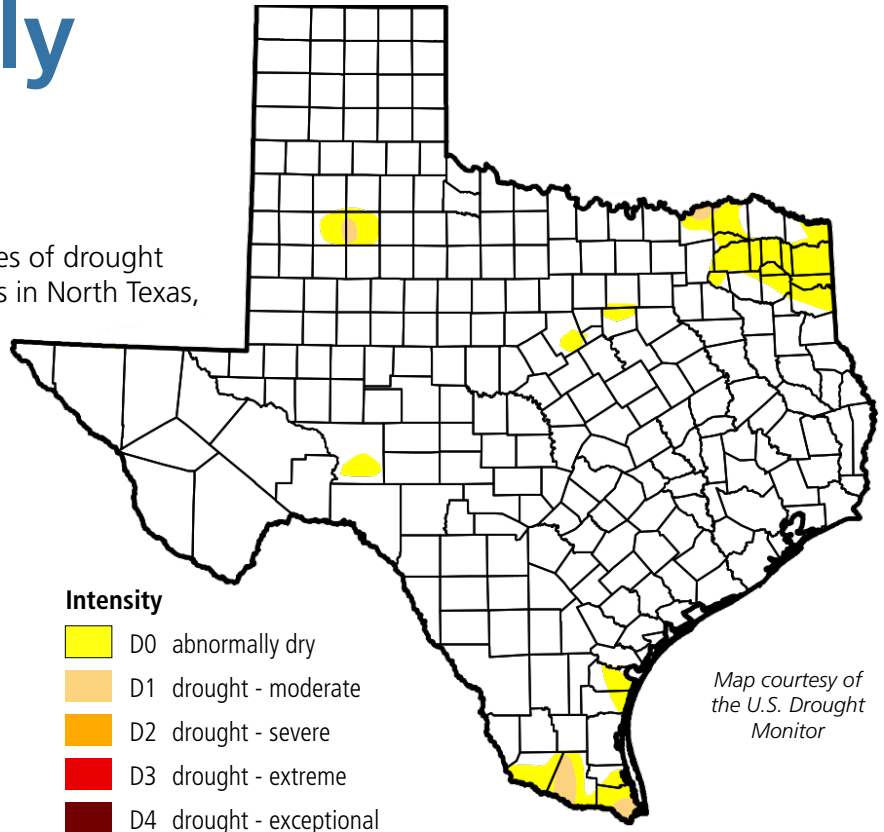


# Water Weekly

## Water conditions

Despite a record rainy end to summer, patches of drought continue to affect Fannin and Lamar counties in North Texas, Lubbock and Crosby counties in West Texas, and parts of the Lower Rio Grande Valley. The National Weather Service expects these drought patches to continue through October. Nevertheless, statewide reservoir storage is 7.5 percentage points above normal for this time of year.

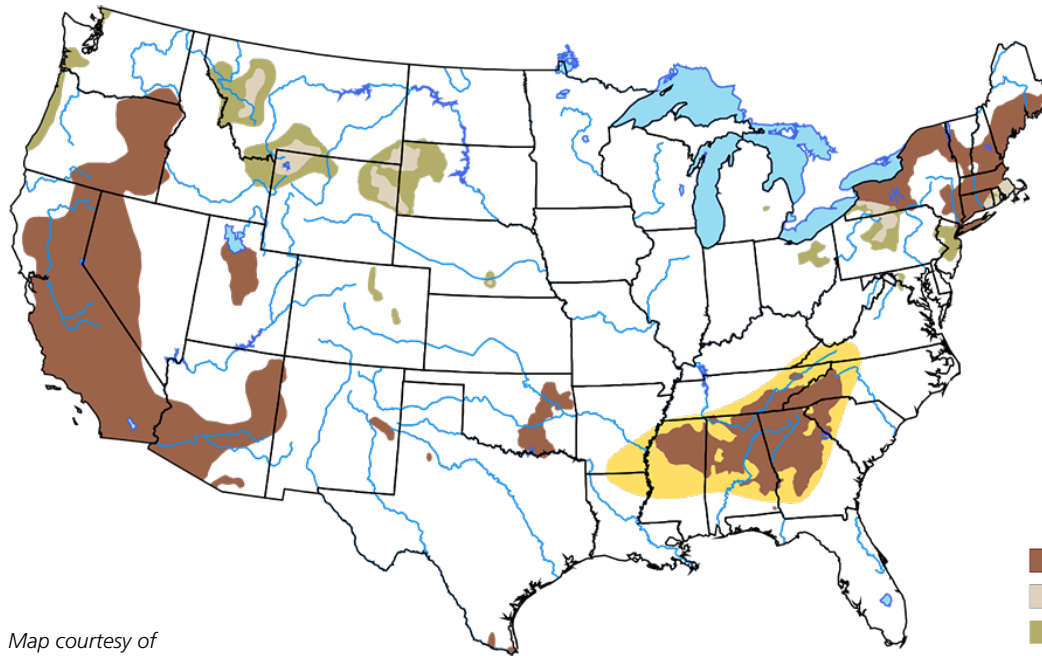


## Drought conditions
