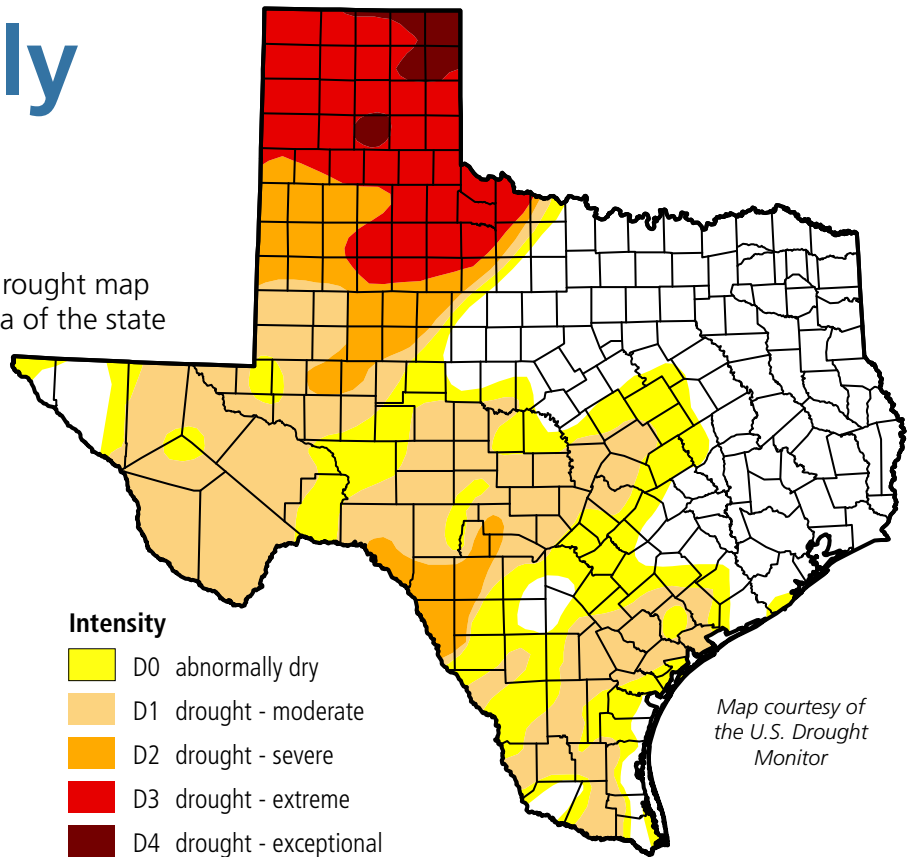

Water conditions

Compared to the previous week, the latest drought map shows a 15 percentage point drop in the area of the state impacted by drought. For the first time in 10 weeks, less than 50 percent of the state is impacted by drought.

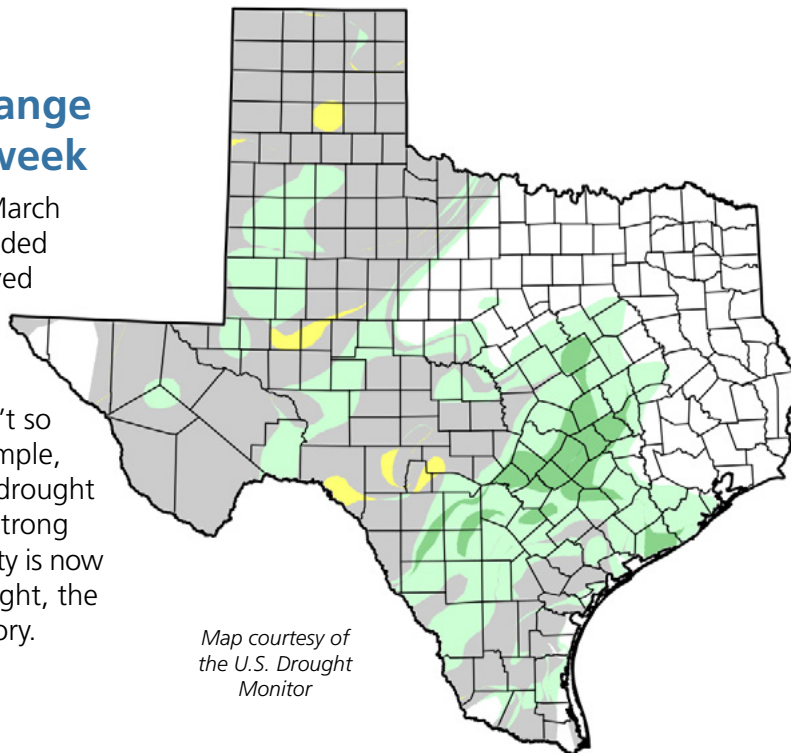
Drought conditions

- ◆ 49% now
- ◆ 64% a week ago
- ◆ 34% three months ago
- ◆ 3% a year ago



Drought change in the last week

The last week of March brought much needed rainfall and improved drought conditions in many parts of the state. Other areas weren't so fortunate. For example, in the Panhandle, drought intensified in Armstrong County. That county is now in exceptional drought, the most severe category.
