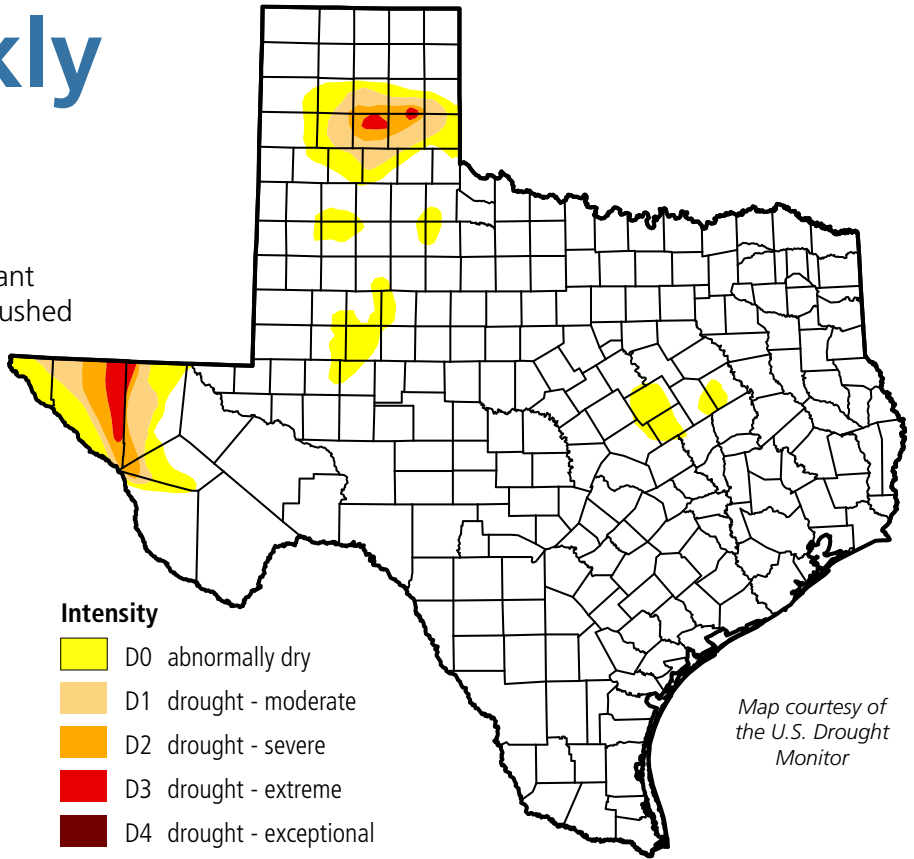

Water conditions

The latest drought map shows that abundant rainfall in September and October finally pushed out all signs of drought in Central Texas. Only two pockets of drought remain in the state, one in far West Texas and one in the northern Panhandle.

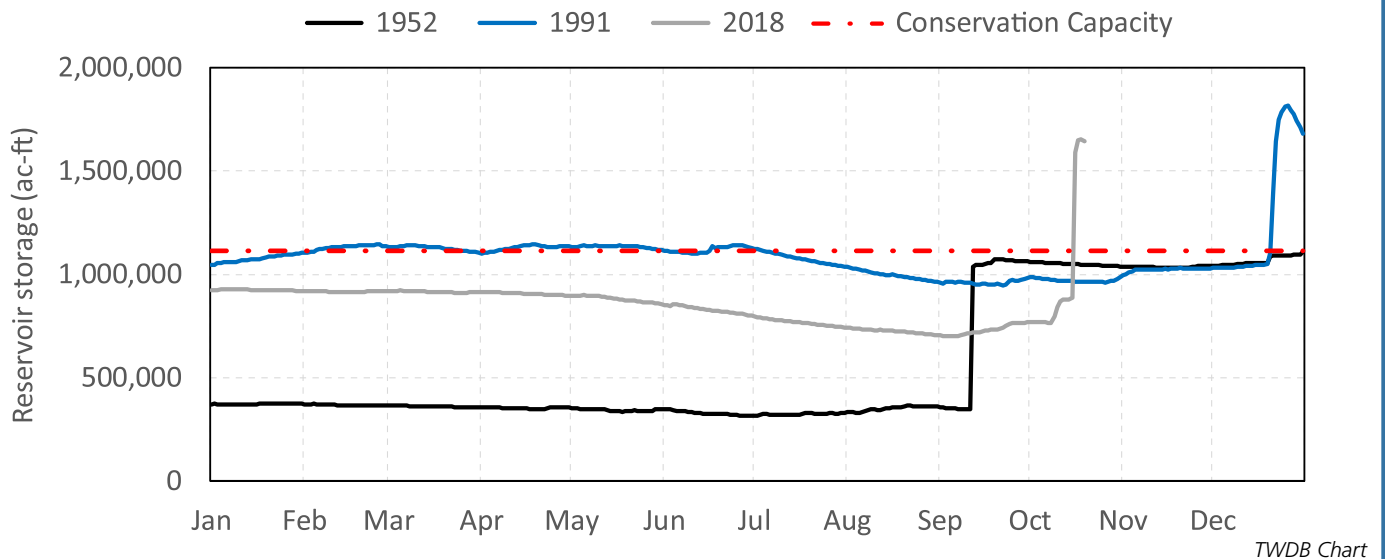


Drought conditions

- ◆ 4% now
- ◆ 12% a week ago
- ◆ 46% three months ago
- ◆ 4% a year ago

Lake Travis reservoir storage

Lake Travis experienced its largest one-week increase in reservoir storage, gaining more than 775,000 acre-feet of volume from October 13 to 20, 2018. Slightly smaller increases occurred in December 1991 and September 1952. The reservoir was built in 1939.
