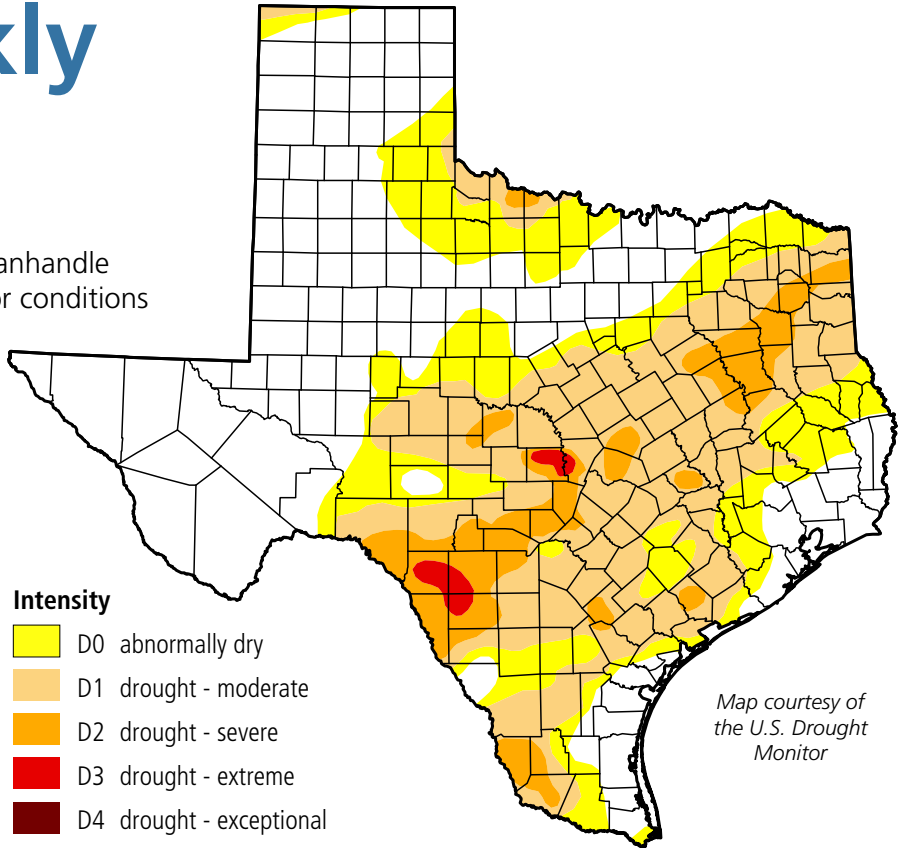

Water conditions

Thanks to recent beneficial rainfall in the Panhandle and North Texas, the latest drought map for conditions as of December 31 shows improvement for the first time in six weeks. Statewide, moderate or worse drought conditions were reduced by 3 percentage points from the previous week.

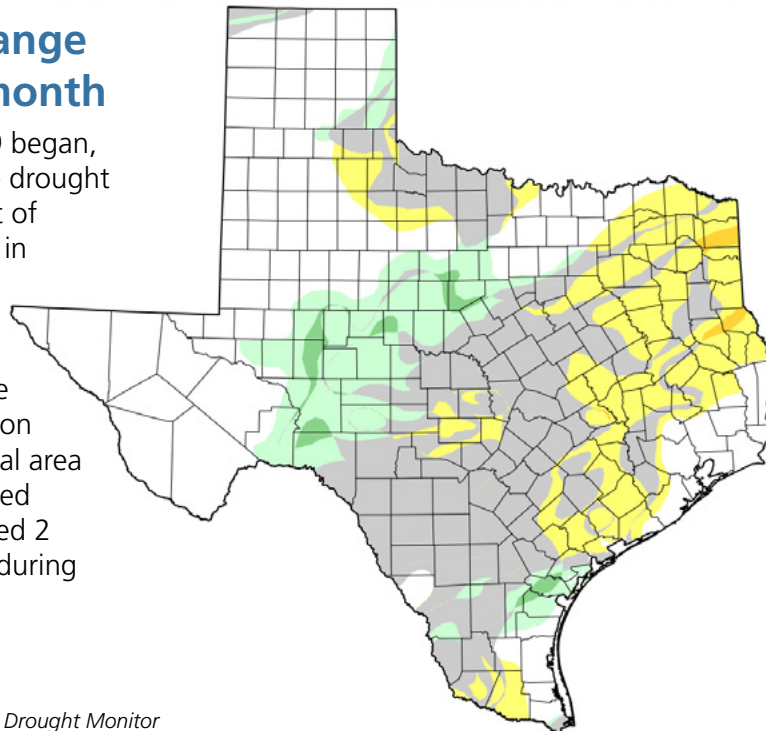
Drought conditions

- ◆ 36% now
- ◆ 39% a week ago
- ◆ 46% three months ago
- ◆ 1% a year ago



Drought change in the last month

As December 2019 began, moderate or worse drought covered 34 percent of the state, primarily in Central Texas. Since that time, we've had some improvement in the west but degradation in the east. The total area of the state impacted by drought increased 2 percentage points during the month.
