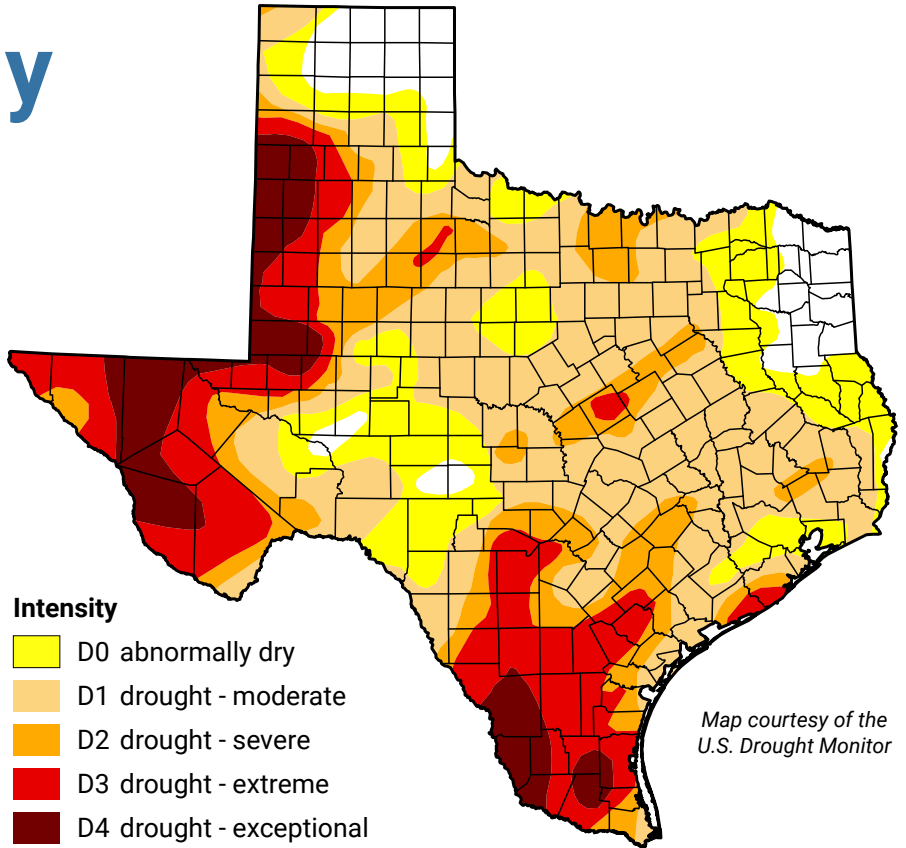

Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of April 13 shows a lot of variety. Almost 25 percent of the state is in extreme or exceptional drought while another 25 percent is drought free (abnormally dry or less impact). Half the state is in moderate or severe drought.

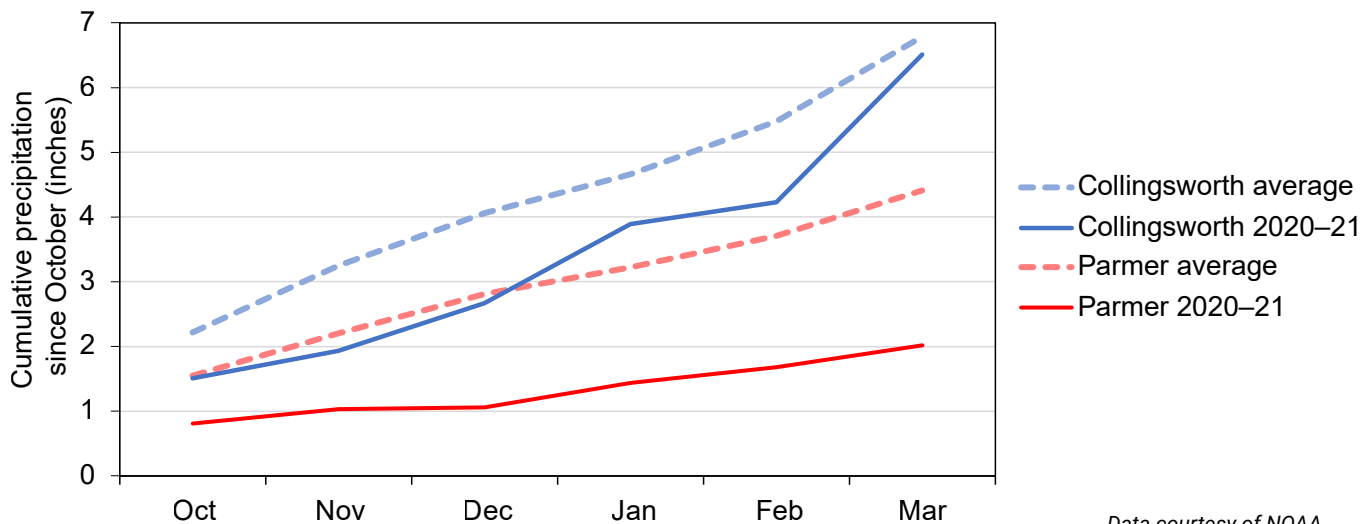


Drought conditions

- 75% now
- 74% a week ago
- 48% three months ago
- 16% a year ago

Precipitation in Collingsworth and Parmer counties

In October 2020, Collingsworth County, in the eastern Panhandle, was in moderate drought. Parmer County, in the western Panhandle, was in exceptional drought. Since then, Collingsworth County has received nearly normal precipitation, bringing the county out of drought. Parmer County has received below normal rainfall and remains in exceptional drought.
