

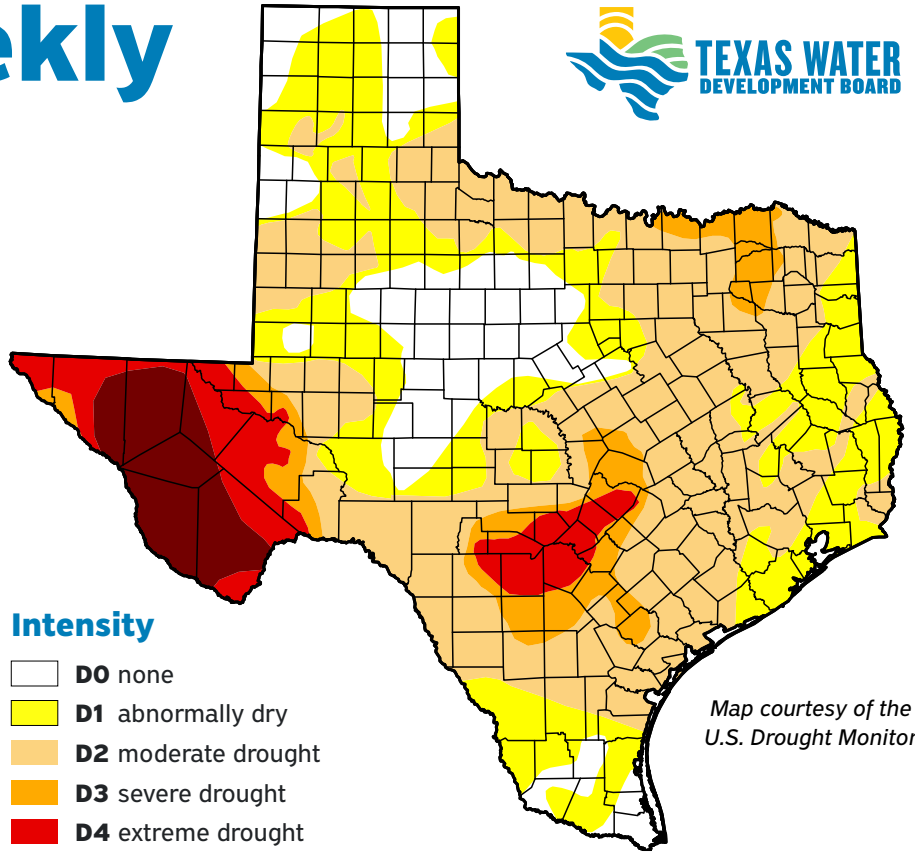

Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of November 12 shows a decrease in drought for the second consecutive week. In the last week, improvements in the north and east outpaced degradations in the west and south. But exceptional drought reached 6 percent for the first time this year.

- D1** abnormally dry
- D2** moderate drought
- D3** severe drought

Trans Pecos Climate Division

West Texas is the epicenter of drought in our state. Drought has been present in at least one of the 14 counties of the Trans Pecos Climate Division since April 2020. Almost half the division is currently experiencing exceptional drought conditions. Only 2 percent is drought free.



Trans Pecos (TX) percent area in U.S. Drought Monitor categories

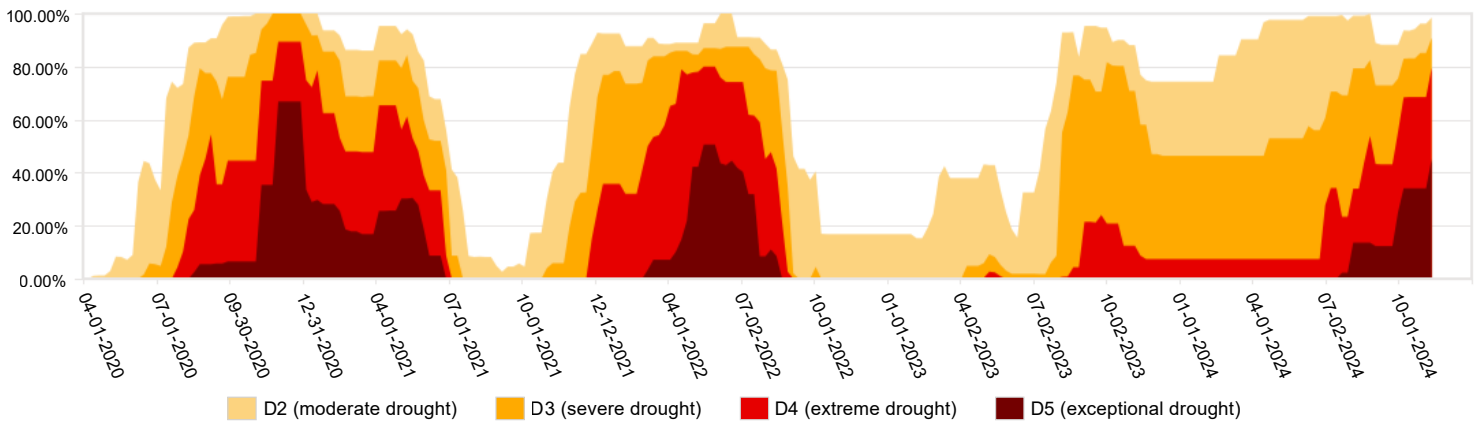
