


Water Weekly

Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of March 11 shows a small (less than one percentage point) decrease in drought compared to the previous week. That's the first weekly decline in drought since early February. Expected dry conditions make continued drought decline on next week's map unlikely.


Intensity

February precipitation

Seven counties ended February 2025 with their driest 60-month period ending in February from data going back to 1895. One county (Real) set a record for driest 36-month period and six additional counties set records for driest 24-month period. Another six counties tied their records for driest February.
