



Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of March 25 shows an increase in drought area and intensity from the previous week. Drought now covers the largest area of the state since October 2024. Recent heavy rains in South Texas may bring some improvements to next week's map.



Drought change in the last month

In the last four weeks, the area of the state impacted by drought expanded from 49 percent on February 25 to 70 percent on March 25. "Extreme" and "Exceptional drought" expanded from 17 to 29 percent. About half the state experienced at least one class of degradation.
