


## DROUGHT CONDITIONS THIS WEEK


Essentially status quo on drought and reservoir conditions as compared to last week with minor changes here and there. The latest U.S. Drought Monitor predicts continued and worsening drought conditions for much of the state over the next three months. So far, we haven't gotten much of a winter bump.

### Current Drought statistics

- 88% of state currently in drought
- 89% a week ago
- 91% three months ago
- 95% a year ago

## RESERVOIR CONDITIONS (% FULL)

### Reservoir statistics

- Statewide: currently 67% full
- 67% a week ago
- 66% three months ago
- 71% a year ago
- Normally 83% at this time

### Key reservoirs

- Amistad (Lower Rio Grande Valley area): 43%
- Choke Canyon (Corpus Christi area): 46%
- Elephant Butte (El Paso area): 10%
- Lavon (Dallas area): 62%
- Livingston (Houston area): 100%
- Meredith (Amarillo-Lubbock area): 0%
- O.H. Ivie (San Angelo-Midland-Odessa area): 22%
- Travis (Austin area): 39%
