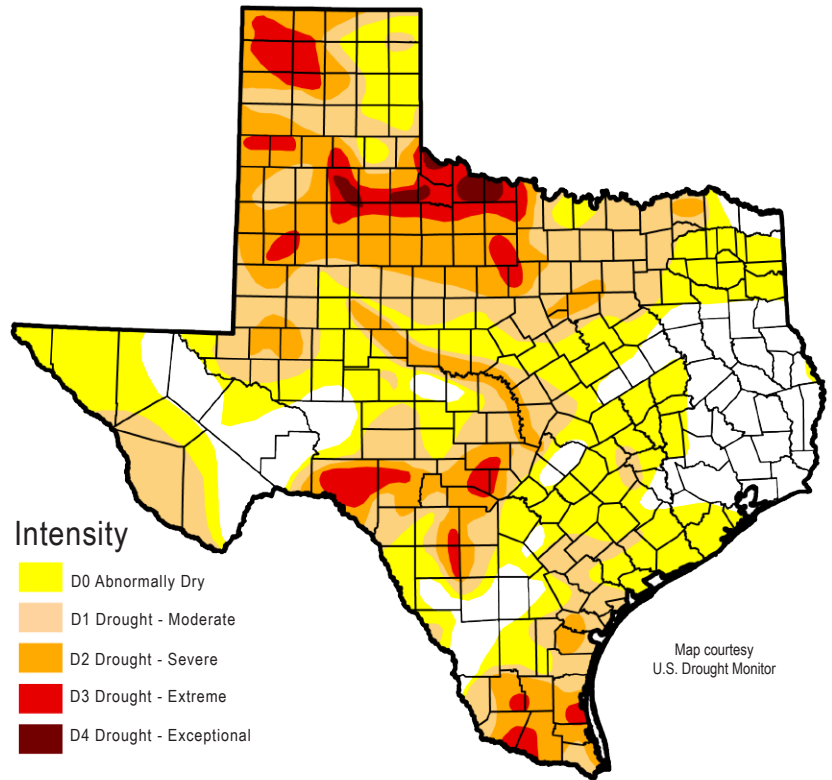


## DROUGHT CONDITIONS

Drought conditions have ebbed in east and parts of central and south Texas but continued and worsened in other parts of the state. For example, the Barton Springs segment of the Edwards Aquifer is out of drought and Lake Corpus Christi is now full; however, the Lower Colorado River Authority has asked the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for emergency drought relief and Twin Buttes Reservoir near San Angelo has effectively gone dry.

### Current drought statistics

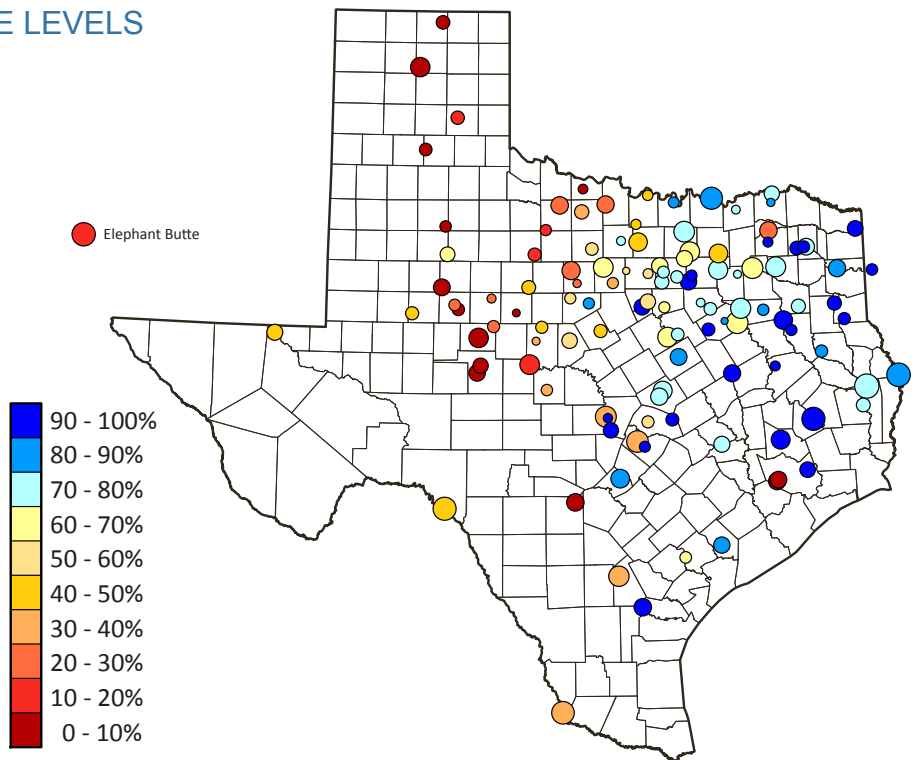
- 51% of state currently in moderate to exceptional drought
- 50% a week ago
- 89% three months ago
- 76% a year ago



## STATEWIDE RESERVOIR STORAGE LEVELS

### Monitored water supply reservoirs

- Currently 62% full
- 62% a week ago
- 61% three months ago
- 66% a year ago
- Normally 80% full this time of year
