

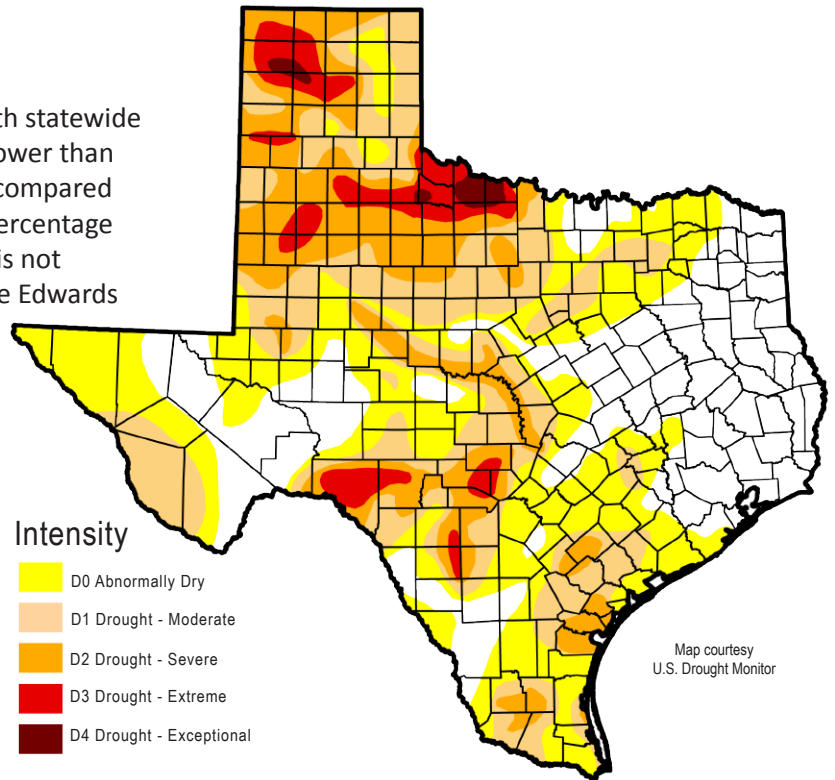
DROUGHT CONDITIONS

We've ended the year similar to how we started with statewide reservoir storage more than 15 percentage points lower than average. Far west Texas is up 25 percentage points compared to a year ago, while north central Texas is down 5 percentage points for the year. As a reminder that the drought is not over, water levels in the San Antonio Segment of the Edwards Aquifer recently dropped to their lowest level for this time of year since the drought of the 1950s, and many reservoirs in west Texas continue to be less than 50 percent full.

New year's resolution? More rain (and implementing the state water plan)!

Drought statistics

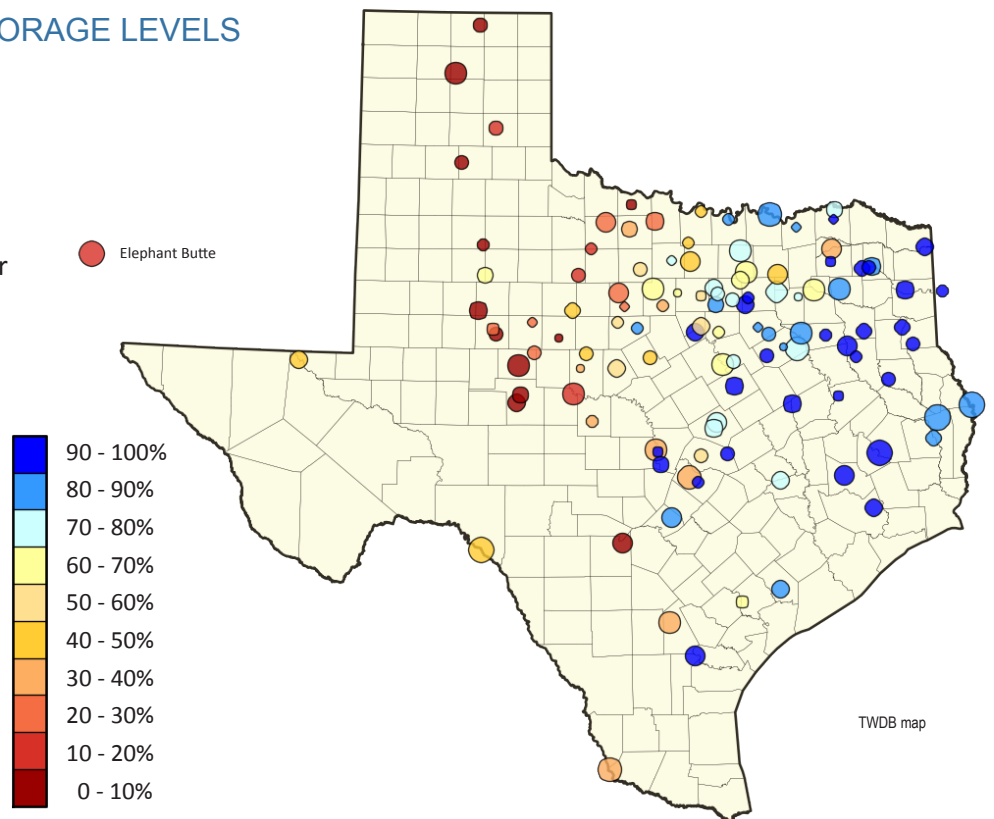
- 44% of the state is currently in moderate to exceptional drought
- 71% 3 months ago
- 87% 1 year ago

Monitored water supply reservoirs

- Currently 64% full
- 64% a week ago
- 60% three months ago
- 65% a year ago
- Normally 80% full this time of year
