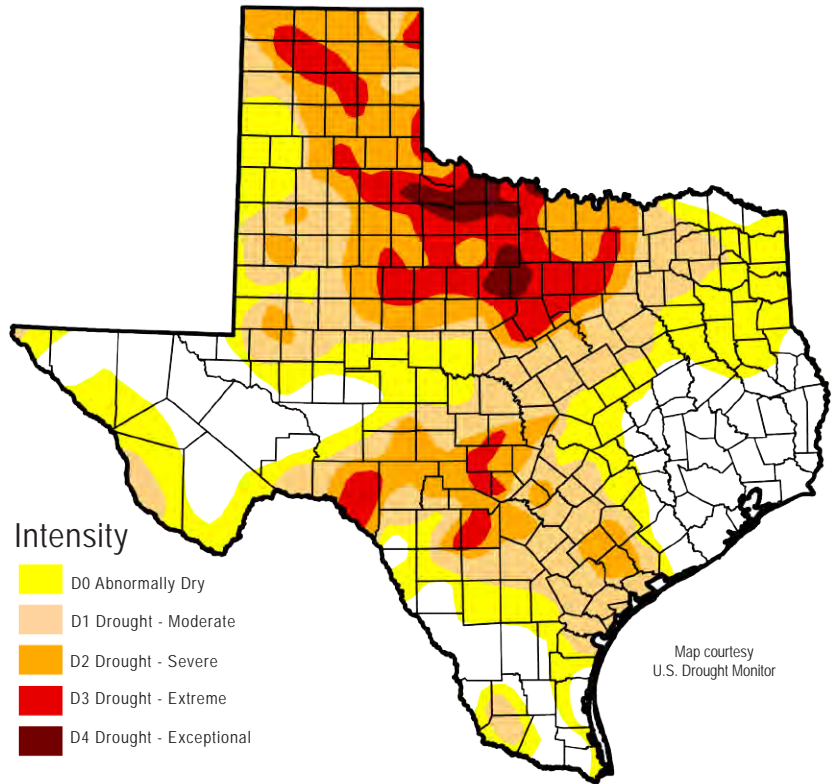


DROUGHT CONDITIONS

The headline this week: Some big rains but not big statewide improvements. Over the past week (9/18–9/25), locally intense rains caused Red Bluff Reservoir to rocket from 56 to 100 percent full (and beyond), Lake Alan Henry to rise from 60 to 76 percent full, and Lake J.B. Thomas to jump from 1 to 46 percent full. Statewide reservoir storage? A slight glibet from 63.6 percent full to 63.9 percent full.

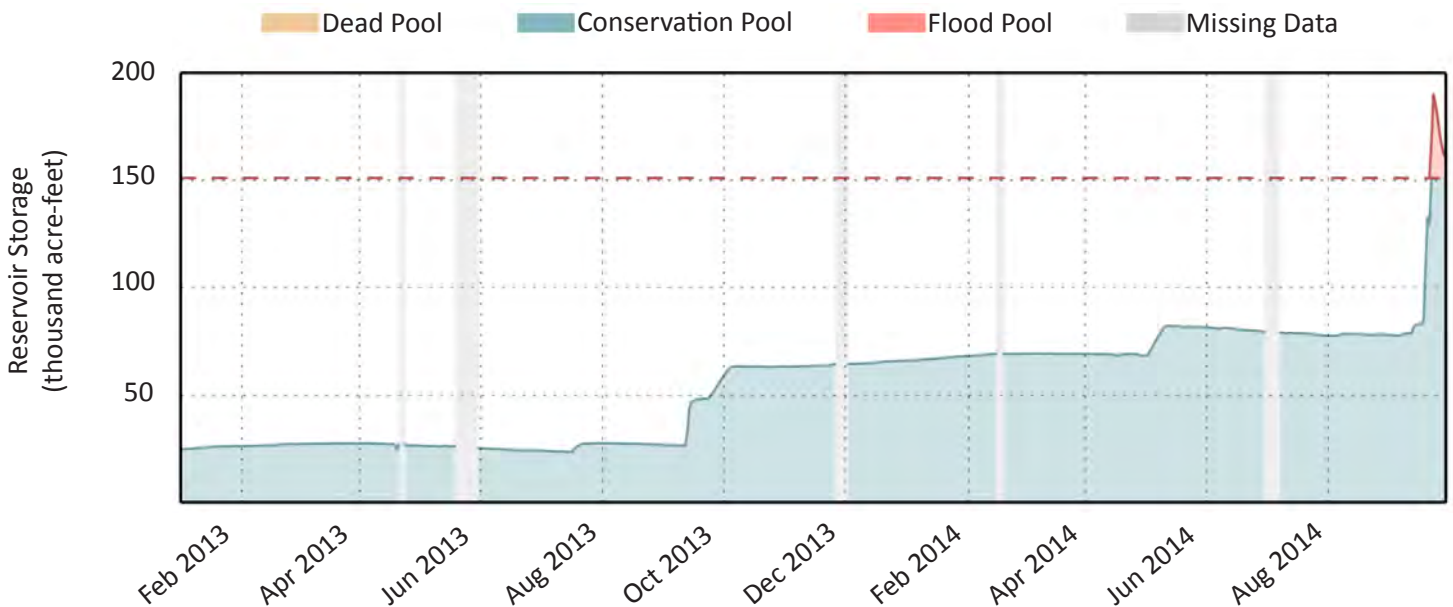
Drought statistics

- 52% of state currently in moderate to exceptional drought
- 57% a week ago
- 69% three months ago
- 80% a year ago
