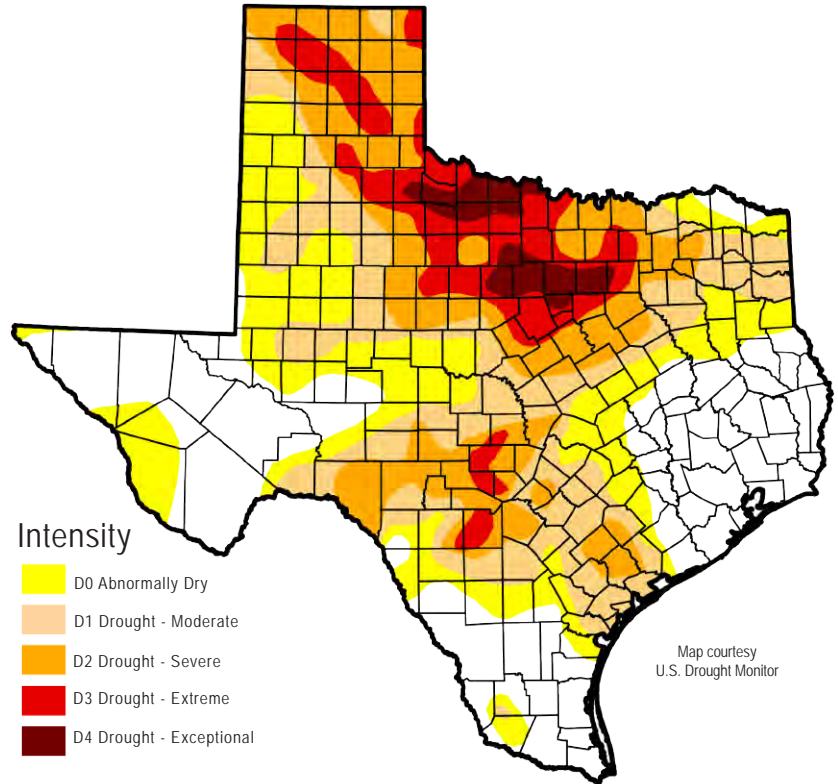


## DROUGHT CONDITIONS

Drought conditions are essentially unchanged from last week, resulting in a downtick in statewide reservoir storage of 160,000 acre-feet. Statewide reservoir storage is 4 percentage points higher than it was last year but still 15 percentage points lower than normal. State reservoirs are collectively about 63 percent full.

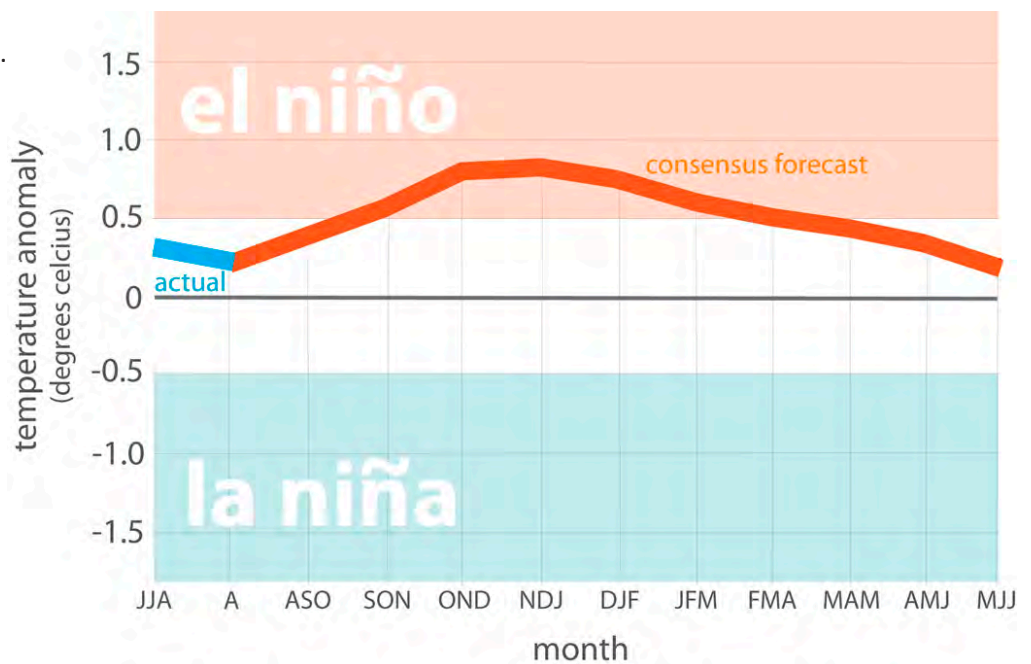
### Drought statistics

- 49% of state currently in moderate to exceptional drought
- 49% a week ago
- 61% three months ago
- 70% a year ago



## EL NIÑO FORECAST

The latest El Niño Southern Oscillation forecast by the Climate Prediction Center suggests a two-in-three chance of weak El Niño conditions developing between November and January, with conditions extending into the spring. El Niño conditions generally bring cooler and wetter weather to Texas.
