Water conditions

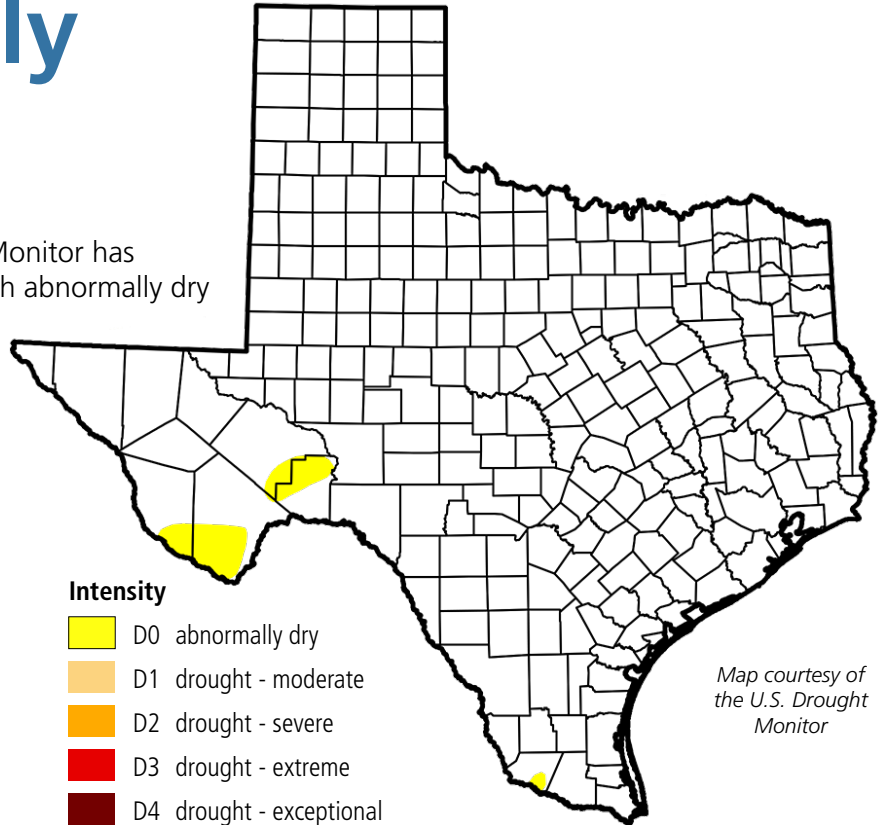
Over the past two weeks the U.S. Drought Monitor has shown no change in drought conditions, with abnormally dry conditions in Big Bend, the border between Pecos and Terrell counties, and a smidge of southern Starr County. The U.S. Drought Outlook projects no drought development in Texas at least through April.

- ◆ 50% three months ago
- ◆ 41% a year ago

Intensity

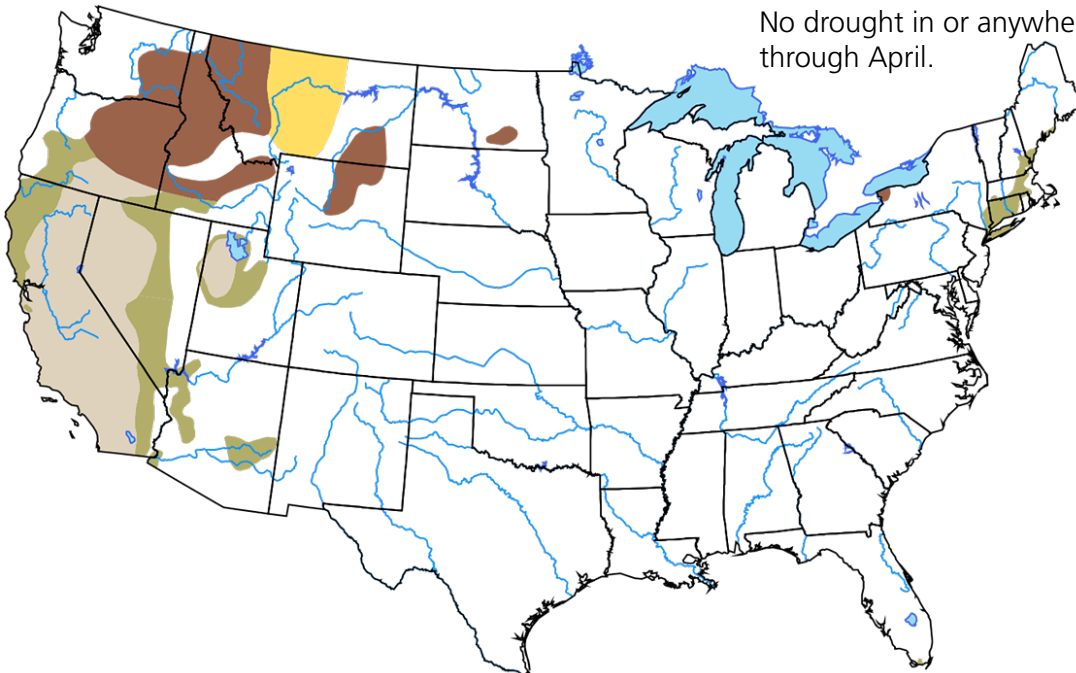
- ◆ D0 abnormally dry
- ◆ D1 drought - moderate
- ◆ D2 drought - severe
- ◆ D3 drought - extreme
- ◆ D4 drought - exceptional
