
Water conditions


According to the U.S. Drought Monitor, the rains last week removed drought and dry conditions from the eastern half

of the state. However, moderate drought peeked into the Texas Panhandle for the first time since October. Unfortunately, the rains also brought historic floods on the Sabine River.
