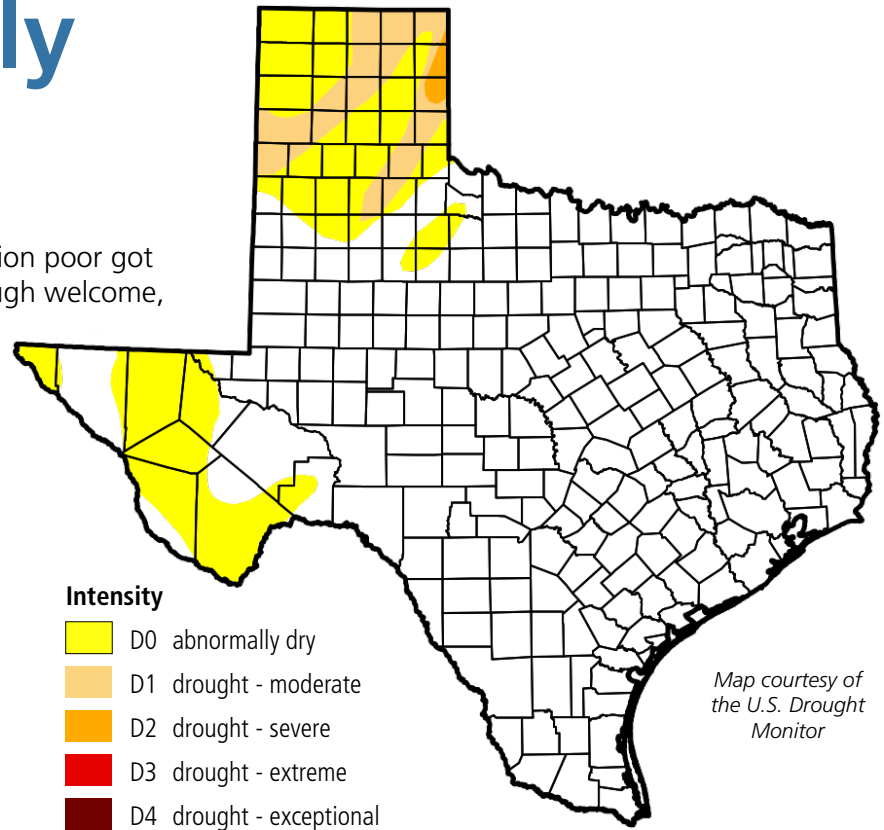

Water conditions

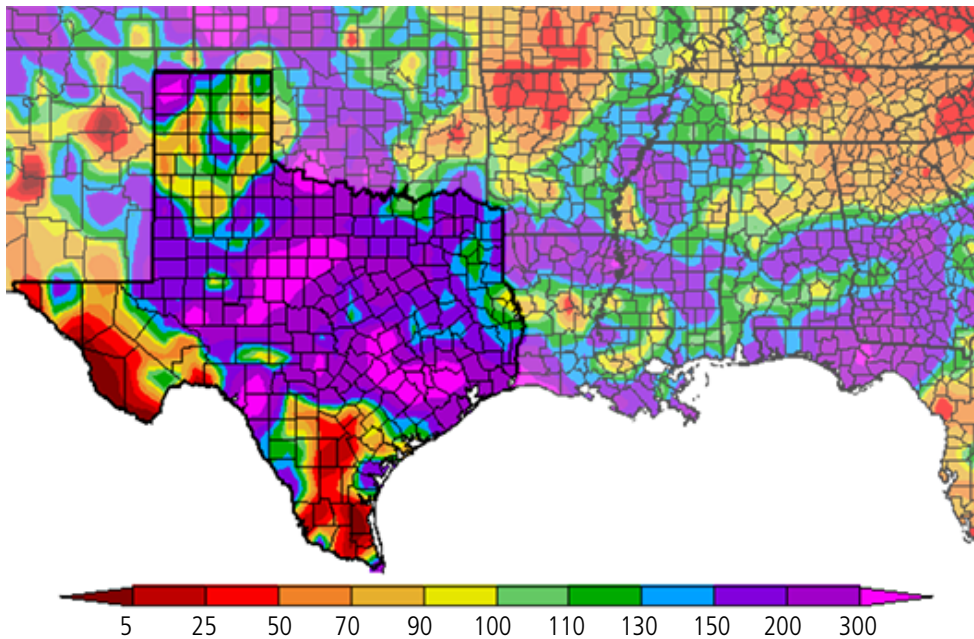
The rainfall rich got richer, and the precipitation poor got poorer. Recent rains in the Panhandle, although welcome, were not enough to overcome longer-term rainfall deficits. Massive rainfalls in the southeastern part of the state led to equally massive flooding events. West Texas was a bright spot where reservoirs for Abilene, Midland, Odessa, and San Angelo saw small improvements.
