
Water Weekly For the week of 09/12/16 Water conditions Drought and dry conditions continue to fade with less than one percent of the state presently in drought. Remaining drought is in five disparate locations (Hidalgo County, Cameron County, Nueces-Kleberg counties, Fannin County, and Lubbock-Crosby counties). Last month tied 1914 for the wettest August on record in Texas.
