
## Water conditions


Drought and abnormally dry conditions expanded last week in the High Plains and San Angelo areas, doubling the

amount of Texas in drought to 5 percent. Rains over the past weekend, especially in West Texas, will probably knock drought down a notch this week.

## 7-day observed precipitation

Tropical Storm Cindy and other rainfall events gave Texas a good dowsing over the last week. Much of the state received at least half an inch of rain with many areas in southeast, north central, and the High Plains collecting more than 2 inches.
