

The latest drought map shows no change from last week. Only 1 percent of the state remains in drought.


Drought conditions

Choke Canyon is one of many reservoirs that benefited from abundant rainfall in September and October. Water level in the reservoir rose more than 15 feet, and storage volume went from a record low in early September to near normal for the time of year in November.
