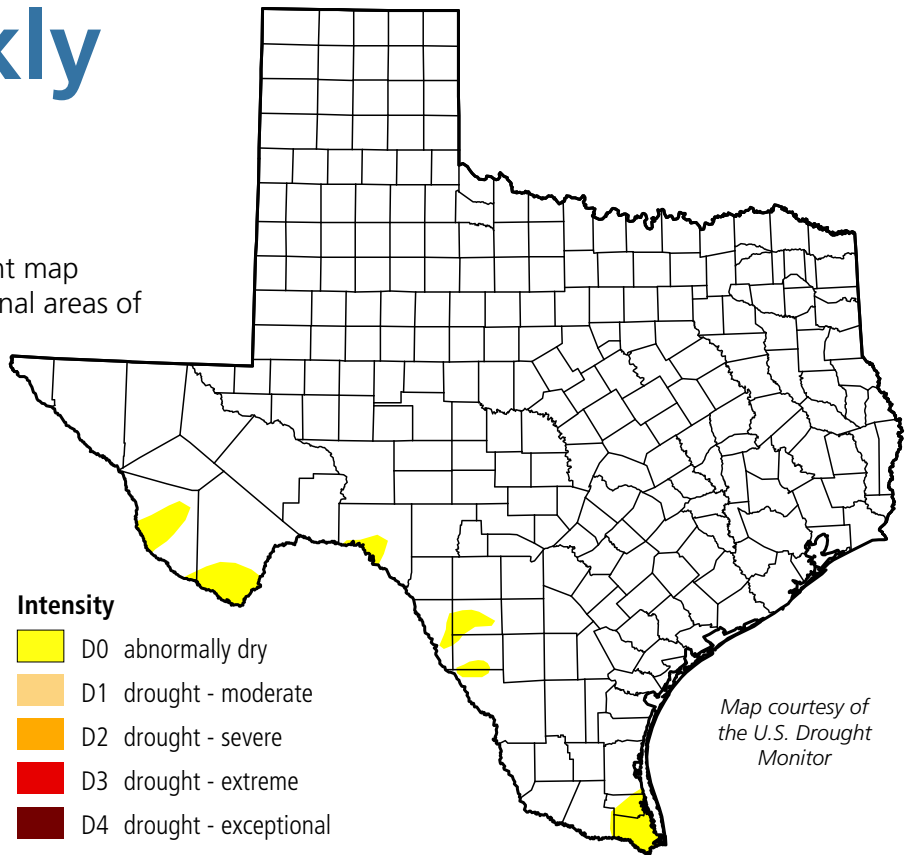

Water conditions

For the third consecutive week, the drought map shows no drought in Texas. Several additional areas of abnormally dry conditions popped up in the Rio Grande Valley. These areas are not currently in drought but could transition to drought without significant rainfall in the next few weeks.

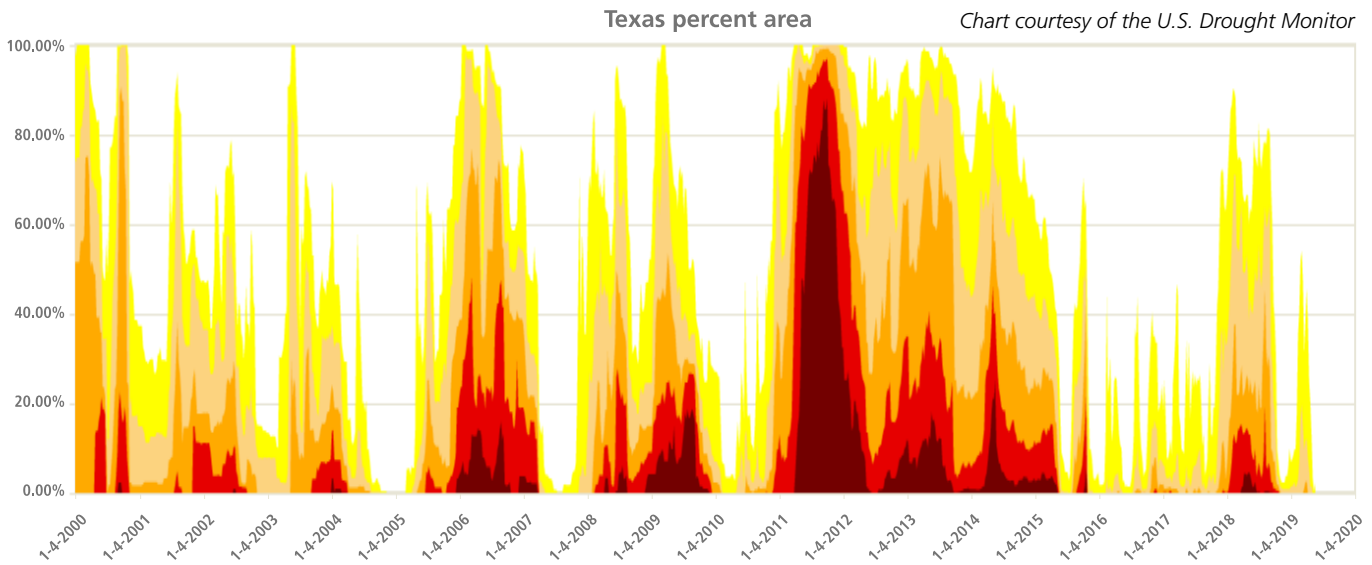
Drought conditions

- ◆ 0% now
- ◆ 0% a week ago
- ◆ 7% three months ago
- ◆ 41% a year ago



Drought timeline

Since January 2000, Texas has been drought free seven times for a total of 84 weeks (about 8 percent of the time). The shortest drought-free period (2 weeks) occurred in July 2015. The longest (28 weeks) began in May 2007.
