
Water Weekly For the week of 06/10/19 Water conditions


The latest drought map, for conditions as of June 4, shows little change from last week. Less than 1 percent of the state in Dimmit, Webb,

and Zapata counties is currently impacted by drought.

Drought conditions

- ♦ 0.2% now
- ♦ 0.2% a week ago
- ♦ 20% three months ago
- ♦ 44% a year ago





May precipitation

May is typically one of the wettest months of the year. May 2019 was wetter than normal, bringing an average of more than 5 inches of rainfall across the state. Scattered areas in west and south Texas, however, received much less precipitation.
