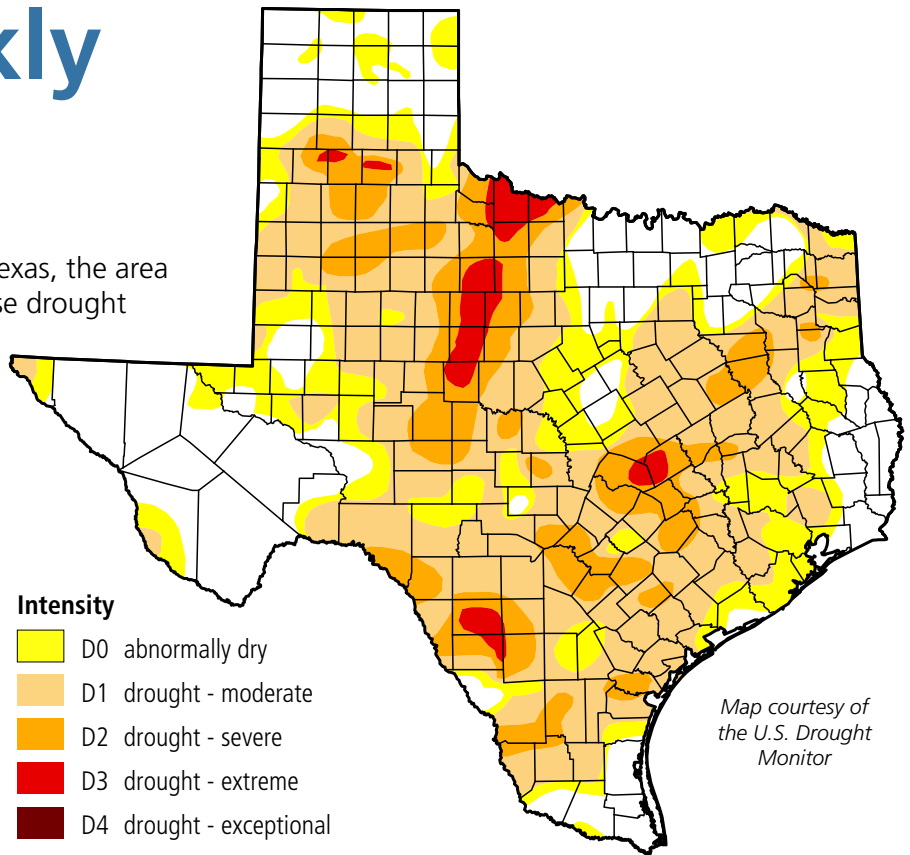

## Water conditions

Despite improvements in south and west Texas, the area of the state impacted by moderate or worse drought increased for the ninth consecutive week. As of September 10, more than half the state is in moderate or worse drought.

## Drought conditions

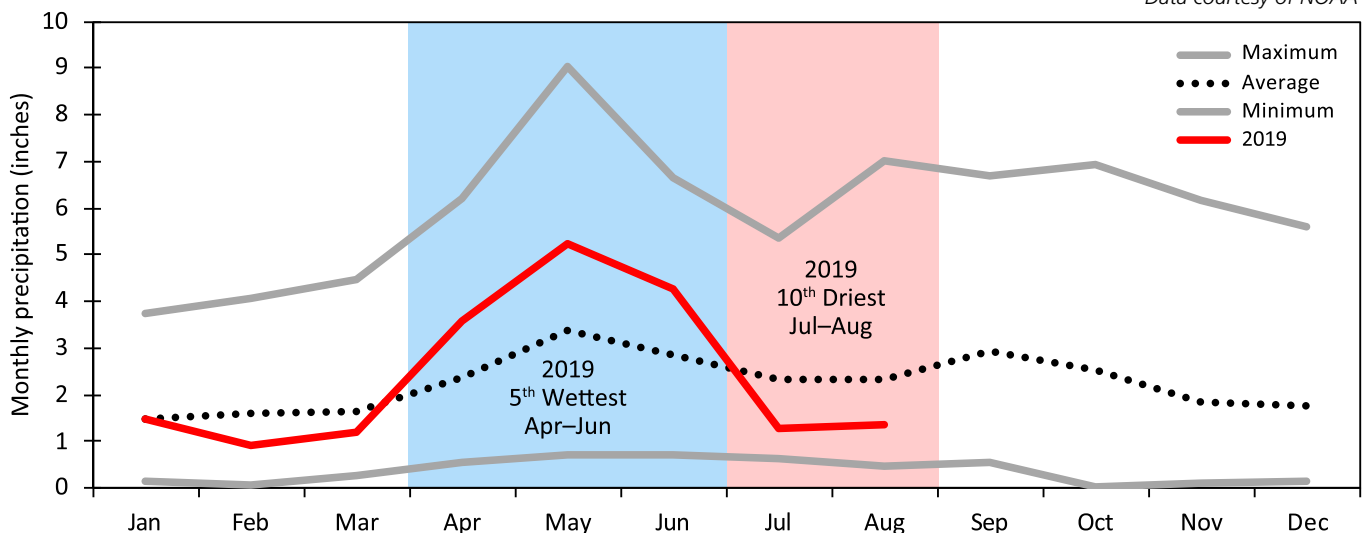
- ◆ 53% now
- ◆ 43% a week ago
- ◆ 0.5% three months ago
- ◆ 31% a year ago



## Texas precipitation

In mid-May 2019, Texas was drought free thanks to the fifth wettest April through June since 1895. Since then, drought has expanded to cover more than half the state, fueled by the tenth driest July through August combined with the second hottest August on record.
