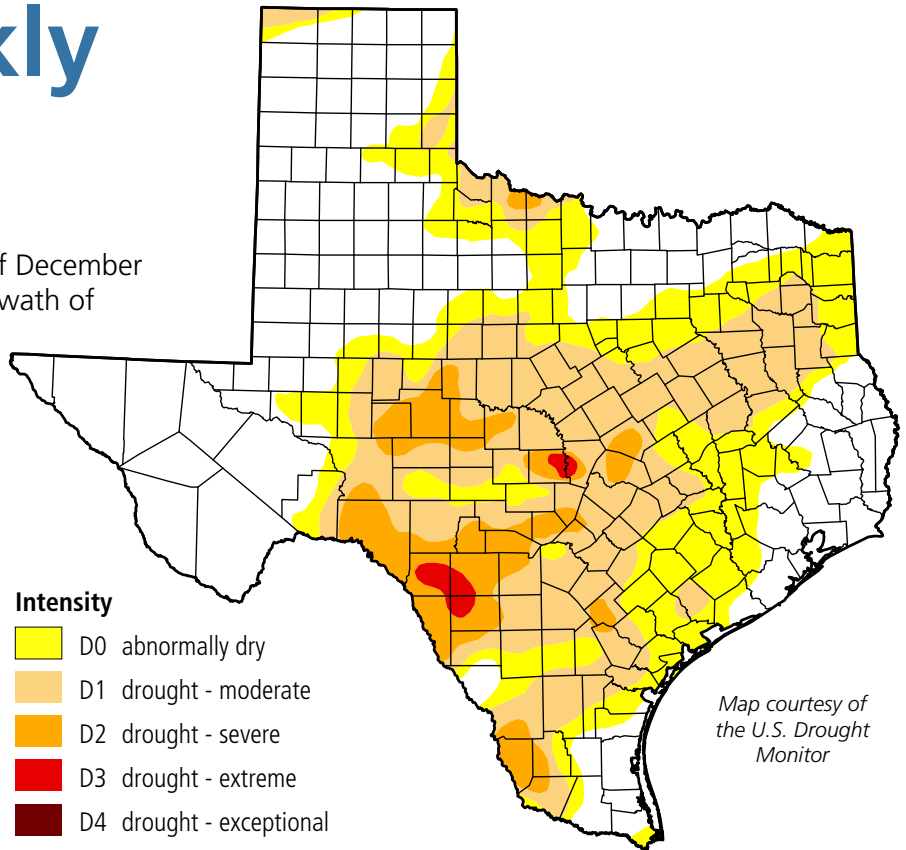

Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of December 3 shows improved conditions for a broad swath of North Central Texas from Midland to west of Fort Worth. However, conditions degraded in parts of central and east Texas. Statewide, moderate or worse drought conditions ticked up 2 percentage points.



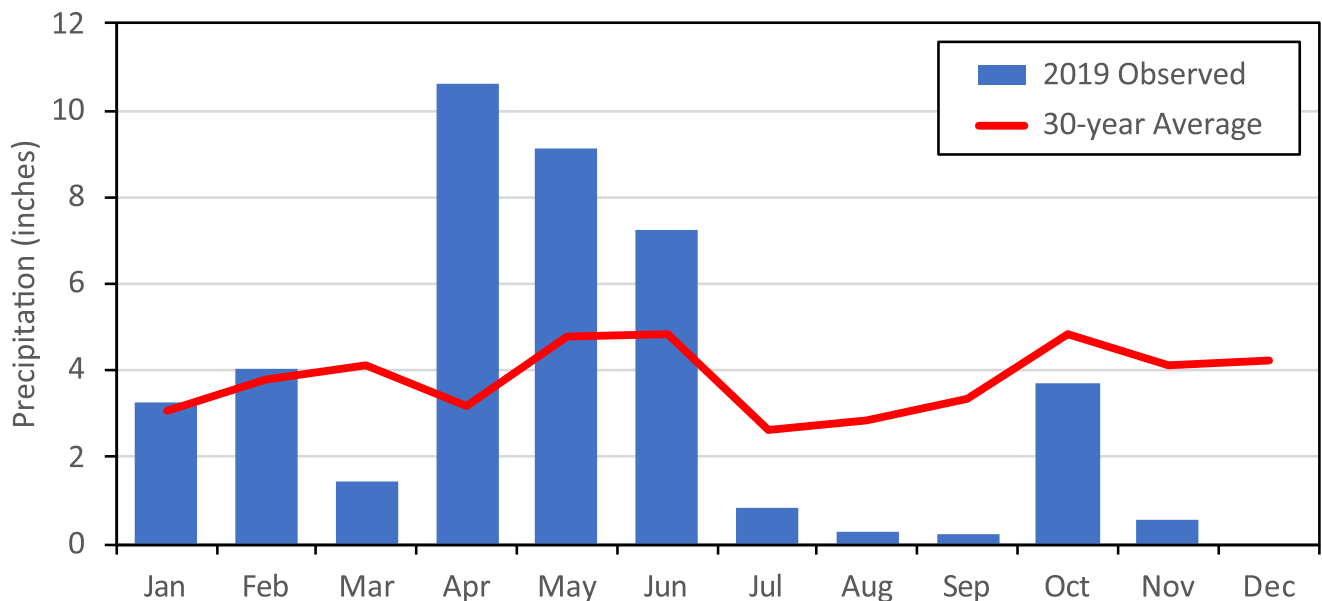
Drought conditions

- ◆ 34% now
- ◆ 32% a week ago
- ◆ 43% three months ago
- ◆ 0.8% a year ago

In the first half of 2019, rainfall for Tyler was 150 percent of normal. Since then, rainfall has been only 32 percent of normal. Drought gripped the area in September, was pushed out in October, but returned in November.
