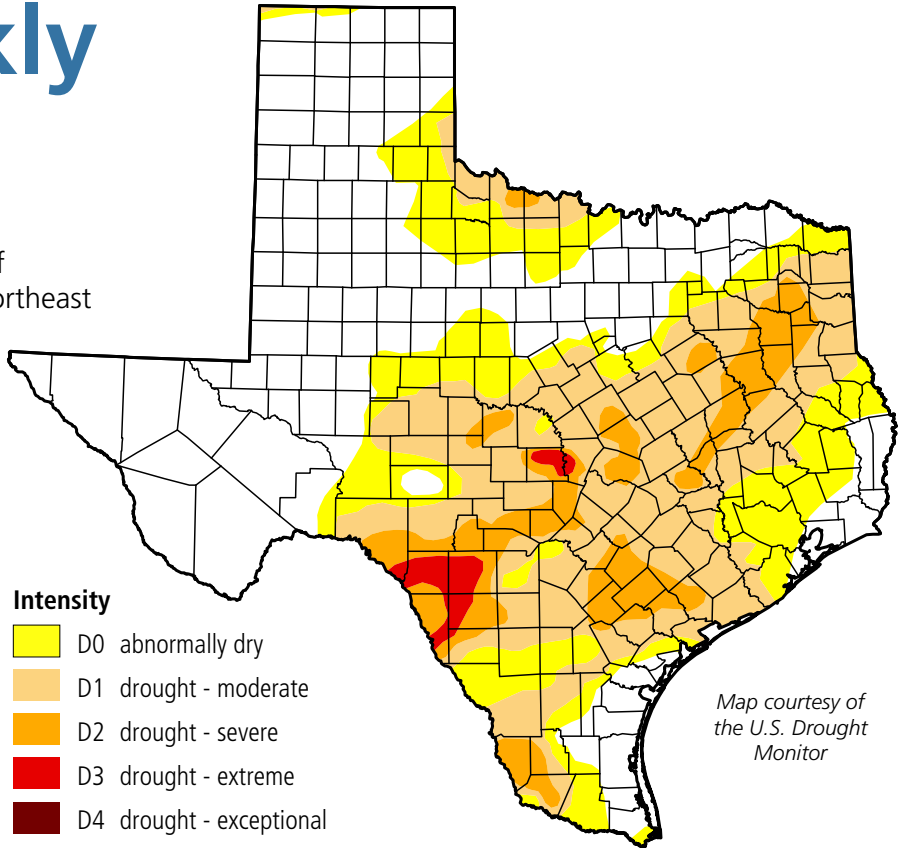

Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of January 14 shows some improvement in northeast Texas. Statewide, the area impacted by drought decreased by 1 percentage point. Thanks to forecasted rainfall totals, we expect additional improvement on next week's map.

Drought conditions

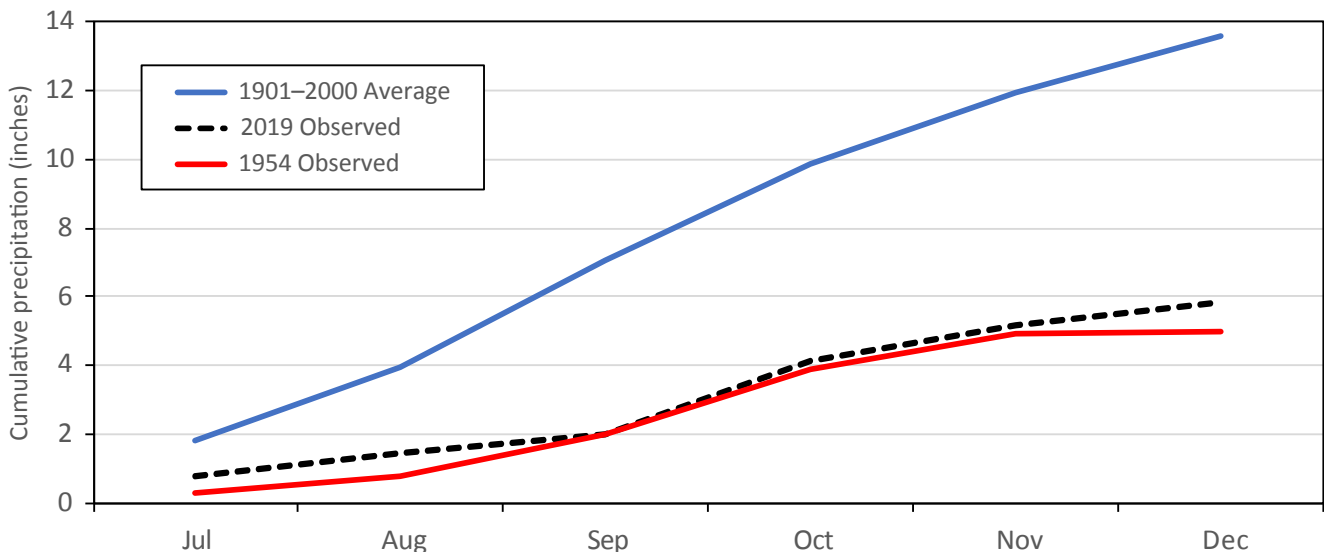
- ◆ 37% now

Llano County precipitation

On average, Llano County receives almost 14 inches of precipitation in the last six months of the year (July through December). In 2019, the county received only 5.83 inches, making it the driest such period since the record low year of 1954 when only 5.01 inches was recorded.
