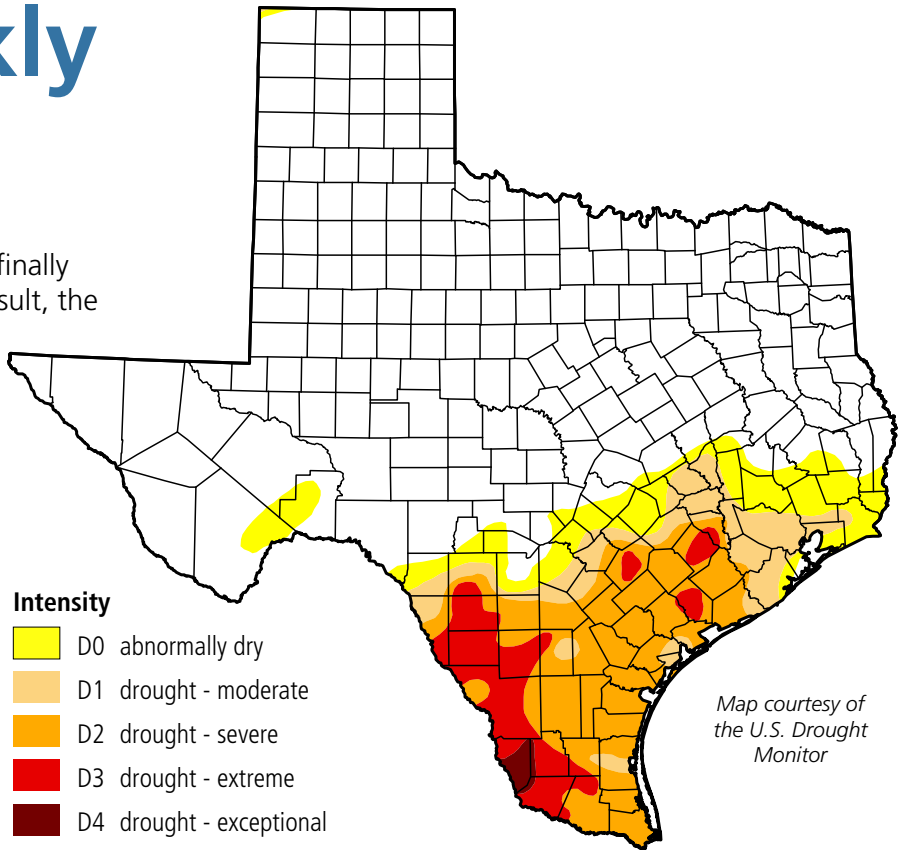

Water conditions

Some of the recent rainfall events in Texas finally managed to push into South Texas. As a result, the drought map for conditions as of March 24 shows improvement from the previous week. Extreme or worse drought is down three percentage points and now covers 4 percent of the state.

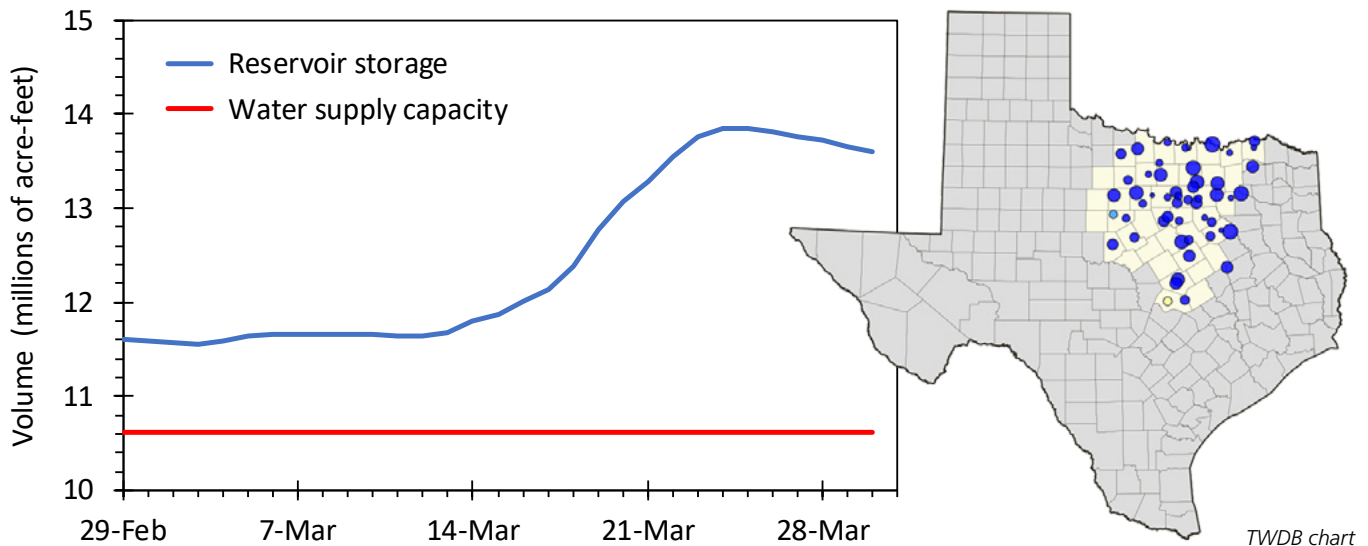
Drought conditions

- ◆ 20% now
- ◆ 22% a week ago
- ◆ 39% three months ago
- ◆ 11% a year ago



North central reservoir storage

While drought is impacting South Texas, North Texas has had an abundance of rainfall. Most reservoirs in north central Texas are filled beyond their water supply capacities. Monitored reservoirs in that part of the state (51 total) have gained more than 2 million acre-feet of volume since mid-March.
