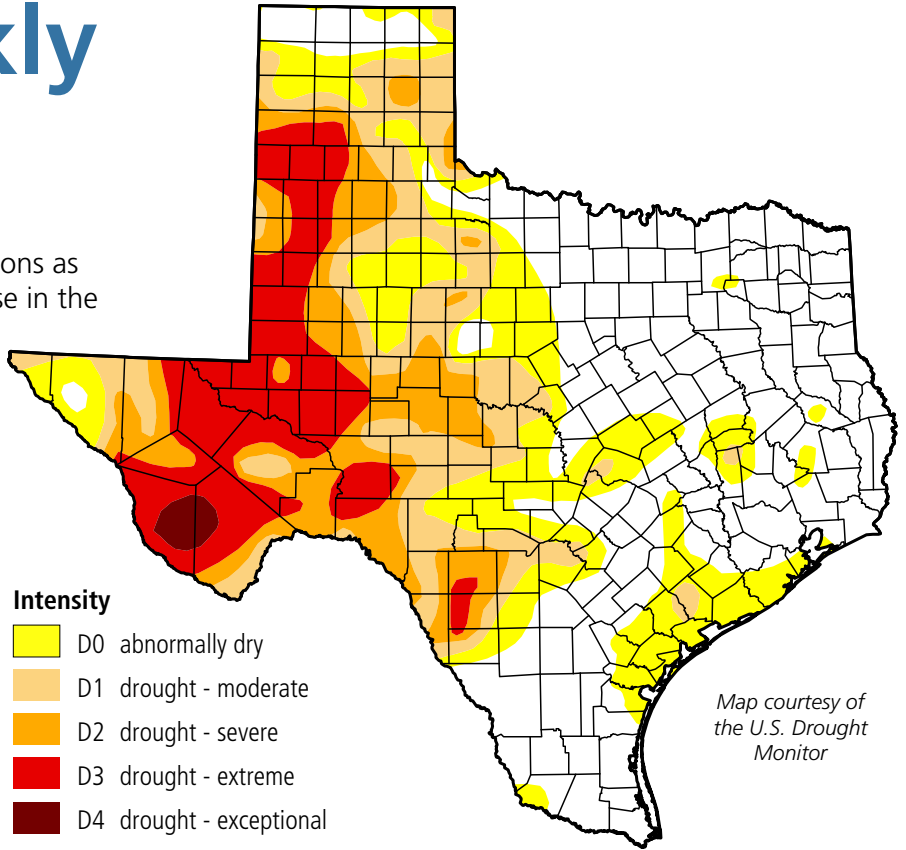

Water conditions

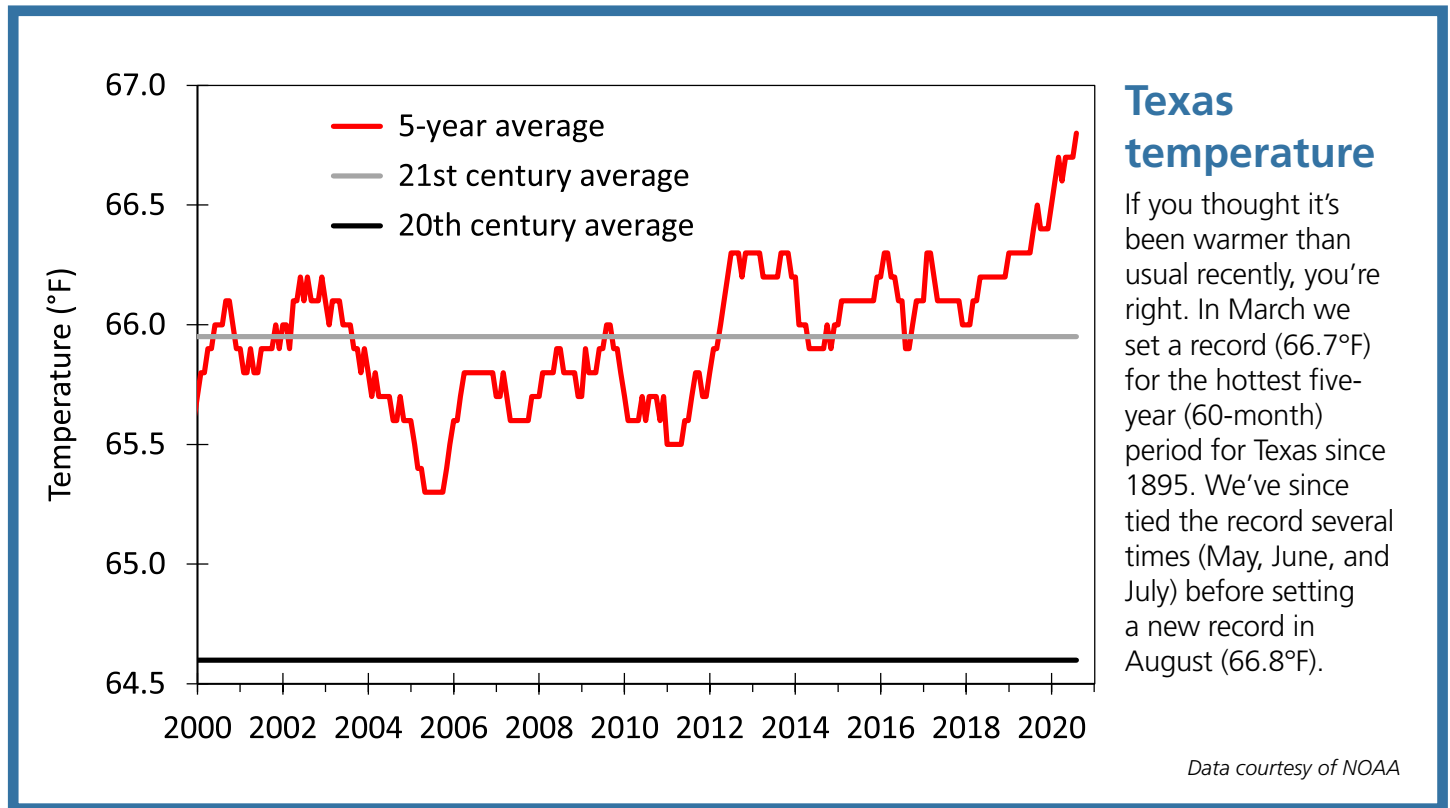
The latest drought monitor map for conditions as of September 8 shows a significant decrease in the area of the state impacted by drought. Areas of Central Texas saw as much as a two-category improvement in drought condition. Unfortunately, drought intensified in parts of West Texas.

Drought conditions

- ◆ 40% now
- ◆ 55% a week ago
- ◆ 23% three months ago
- ◆ 53% a year ago



Texas temperature

If you thought it's been warmer than usual recently, you're right. In March we set a record (66.7°F) for the hottest five-year (60-month) period for Texas since 1895. We've since tied the record several times (May, June, and July) before setting a new record in August (66.8°F).
