


Water conditions

For the most part, recent rains have missed the abnormally dry and droughtstricken areas of the state. As a result, the drought map for conditions as of October 26 shows continued expansion of drought. Expect more drought next week, especially in West Texas and the Panhandle.

2021 Oceanic Niño Index

The Oceanic Niño Index (ONI) describes sea surface temperatures in the Eastern Equatorial Pacific. The return of La Niña conditions was declared after the ONI slipped to -0.5 in September. La Niña conditions are expected to remain this winter, bringing warmer and drier than average conditions to Texas.
