


## Water conditions

Relative to last week, the drought map for conditions as of November 23 shows improvement in parts of South Texas but degradations along the mid-coast and in East Texas and the Panhandle. The area of the state impacted by drought increased for the 10th time in the last 11 weeks.

## **Drought conditions**

- ♦ 40% now
- ♦ 36% a week ago
- ♦ 1% three months ago
- ♦ 84% a year ago





## Midland precipitation

West Texas has become the epicenter of drought in Texas. Since September, Midland has received only 0.16 inches of precipitation. That's the lowest amount of precipitation for September through November in 92 years of data collection and less than a quarter of the previous record low (0.81 inches in 1951).
