


Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of December 7 shows continued increases in both the areal extent and intensity of drought relative to previous weeks. Extreme drought has developed in Hardeman County, the first time drought of that intensity has impacted the state since late June.

Drought conditions

- **♦** 55% now
- ♦ 49% a week ago
- ♦ 0.5% three months ago
- ♦ 79% a year ago





November precipitation

November precipitation was well below normal for most areas of the state with rainfall averaging 1.13 inches statewide, about 60 percent of normal. South Texas was one of the few exceptions with Brownsville receiving 3.84 inches of rainfall, more than double their normal amount.
