

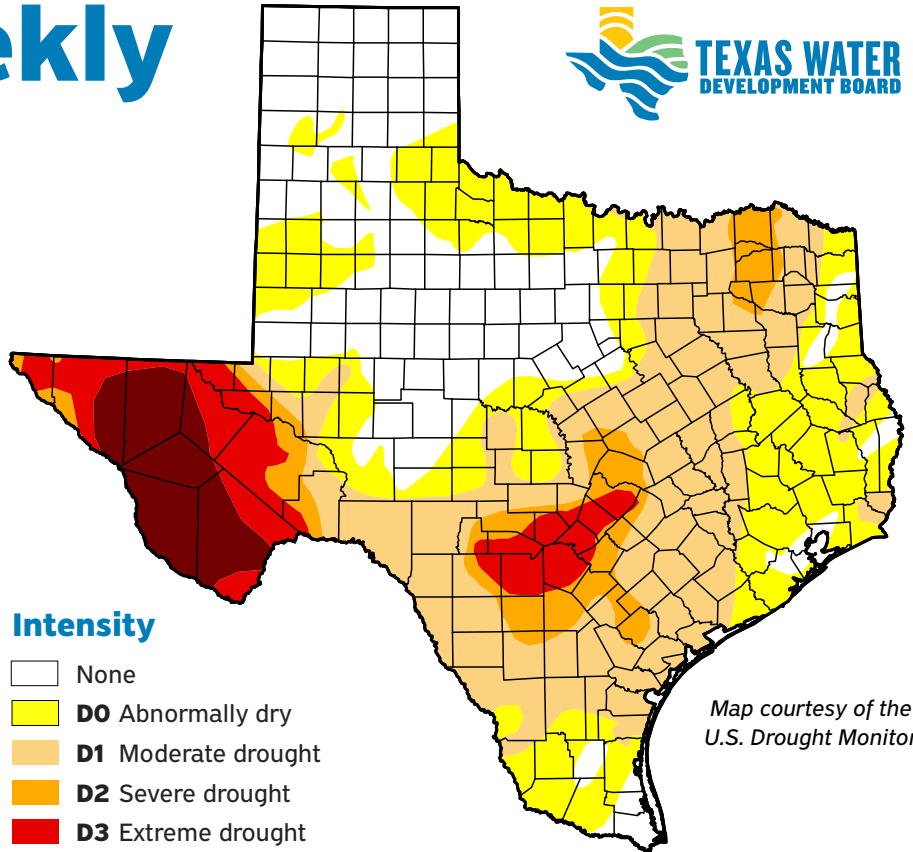

Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of November 19 shows a decrease in drought for the third consecutive week. In the last week, improvements in the north and east outpaced degradation in the south. For the first time in six weeks, drought now impacts less than half the state.

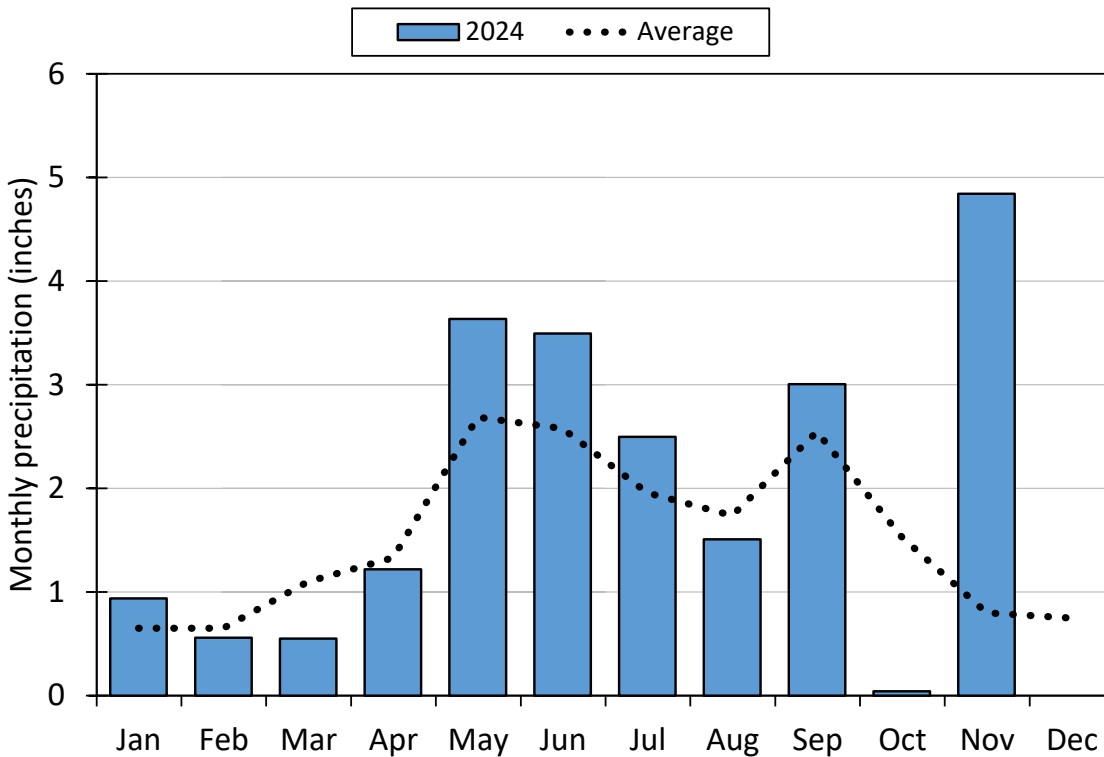


Drought conditions

Lubbock precipitation

Like many parts of the Panhandle, Lubbock received more precipitation than average for the first nine months of the year. But drought returned to the area after the driest October since 2001. Thankfully, November is on pace to be the wettest since 2004, pushing drought away.
